POVERTY THRESHOLD AND POVERTY INCIDENCE

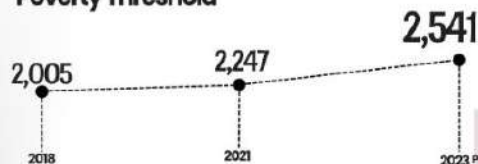
PROVINCE OF MARINDUQUE

Republic Act 8425 of 1997 (Social Reform and Poverty Alleviation Act)

defines Poor as "individuals and families whose income fall below the poverty threshold as defined by the NEDA and/or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs on food, health, education, housing, and other essential amenities of life." (Section 3 of RA 8425)

POVERTY THRESHOLD

Poverty Threshold is the minimum income required for a family or individual to meet the basic food and non-food requirements, also known as **Poverty Line**.

AMONG POPULATION

A Filipino living in Marinduque needs at least

Php2,541,

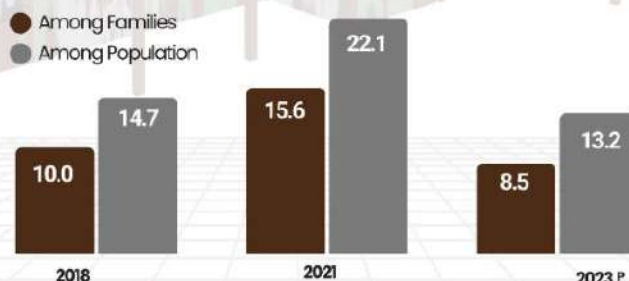
on average, per month to meet his/her basic food and non-food needs in 2023.

AMONG FAMILIES

A family of five members living in Marinduque needs at least

Php12,705,

on average, per month to meet their minimum basic food and non-food needs in 2023.

POVERTY INCIDENCE

Poverty Incidence is the proportion of families or individuals with per capita income less than the per capita Poverty Threshold, to the total numbers of families or individuals.

AMONG POPULATION

13.2%

of Filipinos living in Marinduque were poor in 2023, which translates to

32.45 thousand

poor Filipinos.

AMONG FAMILIES

8.5%

of families living in Marinduque were poor in 2023, which translates to

5.03 thousand

poor Filipino families.

	INCOME GAP (%)	POVERTY GAP (%)	SEVERITY OF POOR (%)

The **INCOME GAP** is the weighted average of how much less people earn compared to the poverty line, shown as a percentage of that poverty line, for those whose incomes fall below the provincial urban-rural poverty level.

The **POVERTY GAP** is calculated by adding up how much less people earn compared to the poverty line and then dividing this total by the number of people who earn less than the poverty line. This gives an average of how far below the poverty line people are.

The **SEVERITY OF POVERTY** measures how far below the poverty line people fall, on average, with more weight given to those who are furthest below it. It's calculated by squaring each person's income shortfall, adding them up, and then averaging this amount for everyone below the poverty line.
