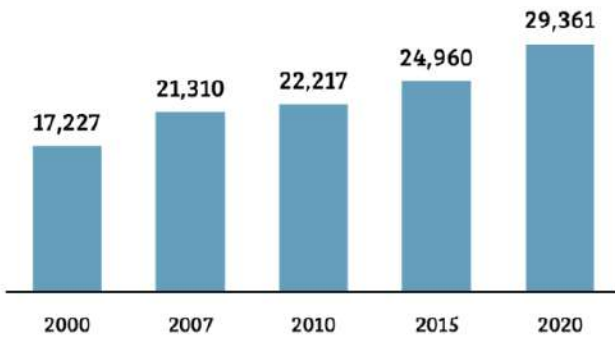


DID YOU KNOW ?

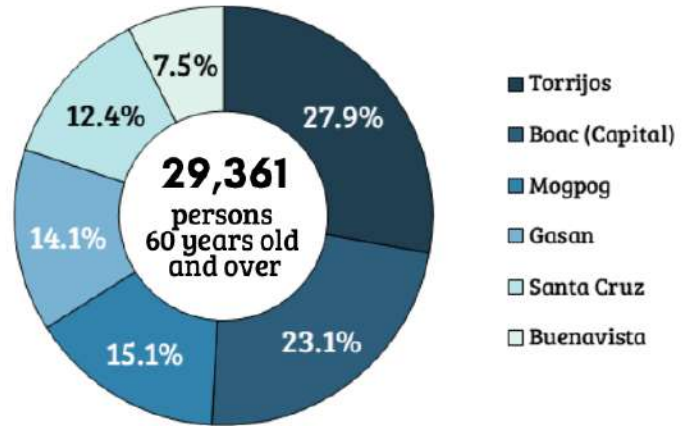
Senior Citizen is defined as any person / resident citizen of the Philippines whose age is 60 years old and over as defined in Section 3 of the Republic Act 9994, otherwise known as the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010. Globally, older persons refer to those individuals whose age is at least 60 years.



In 2020, the number of persons 60 years old and over in Marinduque registered a total of **29,361**, an increase by **12,134 persons (70.4%)** from the total number of Senior Citizens in the province 20 years ago.

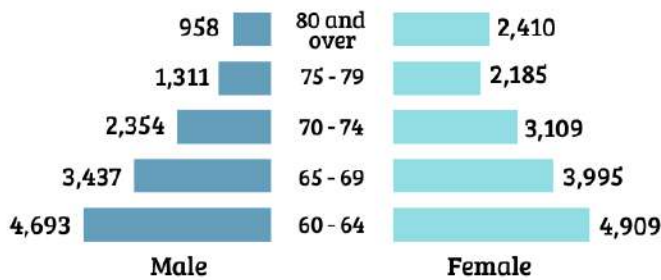


Senior Citizens in the province are distributed across its municipalities as follows:

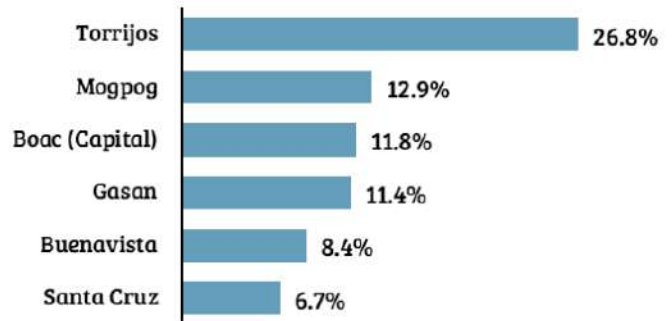


In 2020, nearly **one in every eight persons (12.3%)** in Marinduque are Senior Citizens.

Age-Sex Population Pyramid of Senior Citizens: 2020

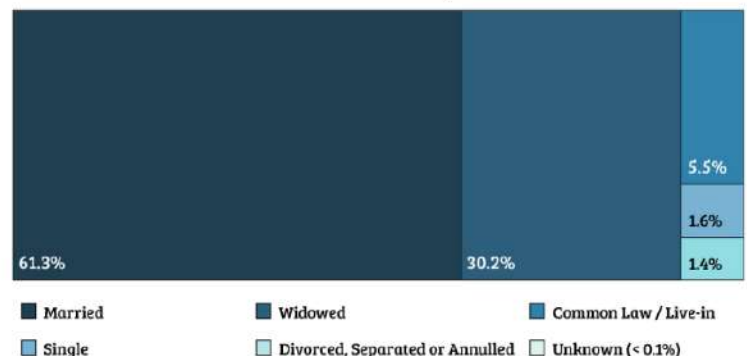


Percentage share of Senior Citizens to the Total Population by Municipality: 2020



More than **three in every five Senior Citizens (61.3%)** in the province were legally married.

Distribution of Senior Citizens by Marital Status: 2020



99.7% of all Senior Citizens in the province are Non-Indigenous Peoples. Meanwhile, Senior Citizens who are Indigenous Peoples and those with foreign ethnicity each had **0.1 percent** share.

89.1% of all Senior Citizens were Roman Catholic. Other top religious affiliations by Senior Citizens were Aglipay (**2.5%**) and Iglesia ni Cristo (**2.0%**).
