The 2009 Philippine Classification Individual Consumption According to (PCOICOP) is Purpose detailed classification of individual consumption expenditures on goods and services.

#### **2002 PCPC**

The 2002 Philippine Central Product Classification (PCPC) is a standard classification of goods and services, including tangible assets based on their physical properties and intrinsic nature as well as industrial origin.

#### **PSGC**

Philippine Standard Geographic Code (PSGC) is a classification and coding of the geographical-political subdivisions of the country, such as the region, the province, the municipality/city and barangay.

#### **2018 PSCCS**

The 2018 Philippine Standard Classification of Crime for Statistical Purposes (PSCCS) is the first edition of the country's classification of crimes. It is a hierarchical classification where criminal offenses are allocated into categories that have a certain degree of similarity.

The 2019 Updates to the Philippine Standard Industrial Classification (PSIC) is a classification detailed of industries prevailing in the country according to the kind productive activities undertaken by establishments.

### **2022 PSCC**
