

2023 POVERTY STATISTICS PUERTO PRINCESA



BASED ON THE PRELIMINARY 2023 FAMILY INCOME AND EXPENDITURE SURVEY

Republic Act 8425 of 1997 (Social Reform & Poverty Alleviation Act)

Defines Poor as individuals or families whose income fall below the poverty threshold as defined by NEDA and/or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing, and other essential amenities of life." (Section 3 of the RA 8245).

POVERTY THRESHOLD

is the minimum income required for an individual or a family to meet the basic food and non-food needs, also known as the POVERTY LINE.

In 2023, a Filipino family with five members needed around

POVERTY INCIDENCE

is the proportion of individuals or families with income less than the Poverty Threshold to the total number of families or individuals.



6.5% of Filipinos living in City of Puerto Princesa were poor in 2023, which translates

19.4 thousand poor Filipinos.



4.1% of Filipino families living in City of Puerto Princesa were poor in 2023, which translates to

3.3 thousand poor Filipino families.

FOOD THRESHOLD

is the minimum income required for an individual or family to meet the basic needs, which satisfy the nutritional requirements for economically necessary and socially desirable physical activities.

In 2023, a Filipino family with five members needed around



POVERTY INCIDENCE AMONG FAMILIES (%)




SUBSISTENCE INCIDENCE
