The highest number of deaths occurred in the **85 and over age** groups with a total of **39** deaths, while the lowest were in the **05-09 and 15-19 age groups** with three registered deaths, each.

233 or 63.5% of the total recorded deaths occurred at home while 131 or 35.7% of the total recorded deaths occurred at health facilities.

January and June have the most number of deaths registered at **38,** each.





a total of **362** deaths were timely registered



a total of **five** deaths was registered late There were **two deaths attended by** private physician, two deaths attended by public health officers , one attended by other health officials and 129 deaths attended by hospital authorities, based on the number of registered deaths by usual residence.

Top 5 Causes of Deaths

- 1. Pneumonia, organism unspecified 15%
- 2. Acute myocardial infarction- 8.2%
- 3. Respiratory tuberculosis, not confirmed bacteriologically or histologically - 6.0%
 - 4. Hypertensive heart disease 4.6%
 - 5. Unspecified diabetes mellitus 4.4%

11 infant deaths recorded

There are **seven** recorded infant deaths among males, compared to **four** females.
