BASED ON THE PRELIMINARY 2023 FAMILY INCOME AND EXPENDITURE SURVEY

Republic Act 8425 of 1997 (Social Reform & Poverty Alleviation Act)

minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing, (Section 3 of the RA 8245).

#### **POVERTY THRESHOLD**

is the minimum income required for an individual or a family to meet the basic food and non-food needs, also known as the POVERTY LINE.



#### **POVERTY INCIDENCE**

is the proportion of individuals or families with income less than the Poverty Threshold to the total number of families or individuals.



32.3% of Filipinos living in Romblon were poor in 2023, which translates to

18.0 thousand poor Filipino families.

#### FOOD THRESHOLD

is the minimum income required for an individual or family to meet the basic needs, which satisfy the nutritional requirements for economically necessary and socially desirable physical activities.

In 2023, a Filipino family with five members needed around



#### 2023 Poverty Incidence Cluster



### SUBSISTENCE INCIDENCE

is the proportion of individuals or families with income less than the Food Threshold to the total number of families or individuals.



6.7% of Filipinos living in Romblon were not able to meet their basic food needs in 2023, which translates to

20.5 thousand food poor Filipinos.



4.2% of Filipino families living in Romblon were not able to meet their food needs in 2023, which translates to

3.3 thousand food poor Filipino families.
