453 children aged 1 – 4 years old already registered to PhilSys Step 2 Registration

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office (PSO) launched an initiative on February 13, 2024, to enroll children aged one to four into the Philippine Identification System (PhilSys), showcasing the office's commitment to inclusivity and accessibility nationwide.

Parents or legal guardians are required to accompany the children and present their birth certificates for registration. If parents are unavailable, guardians must provide additional documents and their PhilSys IDs.

The registration links the child's data with that of his parent or guardian. Only demographic details and a front-facing photograph are needed for registration, with biometric information required at age five. During a month-long effort, the PhilSys Registration Team successfully enrolled 453 children, contributing to a total of 193,839 individuals completing Step 2 Registration as of March 11, 2024.#

Conduct of the March 2024 Labor Force Survey (LFS) in Marinduque




PSA-Marinduque SR conducting interview of respondent from sample households of March 2024 LFS

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Provincial Statistical Office (PSO) of Marinduque is currently conducting the March 2024 Labor Force Survey (LFS), from March 8 to 28, 2024.

The LFS is a nationwide survey of households conducted by the PSA to gather data on the demographic and socio-economic characteristics of the population. The monthly LFS is an abridged version of the quarterly or the regular LFS. It utilizes the core questions of the regular LFS with additional questions related to the COVID-19 pandemic to generate the core labor and employment indicators including relevant indicators for the COVID-19 recovery program.

For this round of LFS, PSA-Marinduque hired two (2) Statistical Researchers (SRs) to conduct personal interviews with 99 sample households from selected seven barangays from the province's five municipalities, including Cawit in Boac, Bagtingon in Buenavista, Mahunig in Gasan, Argao in Mogpog, Payanas in Torrijos, and, Lapu-lapu and Matalaba in Santa Cruz.#


Marinduque's cereals production declined by 22.87 percent in the second semester of 2023




The province of Marinduque's overall productions of cereals for the second semester of 2023 was 8,522.00 metric tons, a 22.87 percent decrease from 11,049.00 metric tons of the same period in the previous year. (Figure 1)

The overall production of cereals for the second semester of 2022 were comprised of 10,381.00 metric tons, or 93.95 percent, of palay and 668.00 metric tons, or 6.05 percent, of corn. (Figure 2a)

Meanwhile, in the second semester of 2023, palay accounted for $8,\!136.00$ metric tons, or 95.47 percent, of the overall production, while corn accounted for 386.00 metric tons, or 4.53 percent. (Figure 2b)#

March 2024 Inflation Report

It is equivalent to a change of -0.6 percentage points from the inflation rate in the previous month at 1.5 percent. In the same reference month of the previous year, it was posted at 9.4 percent. The downtrend of inflation in March 2024 was mainly driven by the combined deceleration in the indices for selected commodity groups such as housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels at 1.2 percent, food and non-alcoholic beverages at -1.4 percent, and restaurants and accommodation services at 4.5 percent.

On April 12, 2024 - PSA-Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office (PSO) held a press conference at the Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office in Boac, Marinduque. Ms. Gemma N. Opis, Chief Statistical Specialist of PSA Marinduque, spearheaded the event, delivering the March 2024 inflation report of the province.

The discussion highlighted the specific commodity groupings impacting price fluctuations and delved into the primary factors influencing the province's inflation rate.

Concluding the press conference was a question-and-answer session, providing members of the media and attendees the opportunity to engage with CSS Opis, gaining further insights into the inflation report and its implications.

Overall, the event served as a platform to inform, educate, and empower the community with valuable statistical data and analysis to make informed decisions in the future.#

195,158 Marinduqueños Registered to PhilSys Step 2 Registration (continued from page 1)

This is equivalent to 32.32 percent of the total quarterly target. For the month of January, PhilSys Registration team registered a total of 1,020 registrants, 1,797 for the month of February and 2,206 for the month of March.

On 28 June 2021, PhilSys started the Step 2 Registration in the province of Marinduque with a target of 215,350 registrants, all of which are five years old and above. By the beginning of 2024, the Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office has already registered a cumulative total of 195,158 Marinduqueños, which is equivalent to 90.62 percent of the target individuals set in 2021.#

Subsequently, in February 2024, there were 2,324 ePhillDs issued, accounting for 53.14 percent of the monthly target.

And, as of 31 March 2024, the total number of issued ePhillDs in the province of Marinduque has reached 156,454. Among all municipalities, the highest number of issued ePhillDs was recorded in the Municipality of Santa Cruz, with a total of 40,470 ePhillDs, followed by the Municipality of Boac with 30,070, and in the Municipality of Gasan with 24,500. In the Municipality of Mogpog, there were 22,579 ePhillDs issued. Additionally, in the Municipalities of Torrijos and Buenavista, there were 21,773 and 16,980 ePhillDs issued, respectively. Meanwhile there are 82 ePhillDs that were issued to residents of other provinces. #

PURCHASING POWER OF PESO

The Purchasing Power of Peso (PPP) refers to the **amount of** goods and services that can be bought with one unit of the Philippine peso. It is a measure of the real value of the peso in a given period relative to a chosen reference period (2018).

It indicates the strength or weakness of the currency in terms of real purchasing ability. Factors such as inflation, interest rates, economic growth, and exchange rates influence its purchasing power.

Understanding the peso's purchasing power helps individuals and businesses make financial decisions and assess the value of income and savings. Policymakers also monitor it to

maintain price stability and foster economic growth.

PSA-Marinduque PSO conducts March 2024 Survey of Retail Prices of Selected Commodities and Services for the generation of Consumer Price Index (CPI)

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office (PSO) completed the March 2024 round of the Survey of Retail Prices of Selected Commodities and Services for the Generation of Consumer Price Index (CPI).

The survey was conducted in two phases: the first from March 1-5, 2024, and the second from March 15-17, 2024. The Retail Price Survey (RPS) is a nationwide monthly survey aimed at gathering data on retail prices and other pertinent marketing information at selected major trading centers throughout the province.

The PSA-Marinduque PSO has employed six Statistical Researchers (SRs) to collect data on the prices of a particular range of goods and services. The SRs have visited six designated outlets located throughout the province for this purpose.#

Marinduque Labor Market Resilience: Pre-Pandemic to Post-Pandemic Trends (2018-2022)

The labor force saw minor declines in 2019 and 2020 before a notable surge in 2021, peaking at 108.1 thousand, then declining to 99.0 thousand in 2022. Conversely, the employed population showed slight declines in 2019 and 2020 but surged in 2022 to 94.5 thousand, surpassing previous levels. The unemployed population saw an uptick in 2020, followed by decreases in 2021 and 2022. The underemployed population peaked in 2020 and 2021 before declining significantly in 2022. (Table 1)

The labor force participation rate slightly increased from 2018 to 2019, declined in 2020, surged in 2021 to 68.0 percent, then slightly receded to 61.7 percent in 2022. The employment rate remained robust, with notable peaks at 96.0 percent in 2019 and 95.5 percent in 2022, after a dip to 90.0 percent in 2020. The unemployment rate spiked to 10.0 percent in 2020 before declining to 4.5 percent in 2022. The underemployment rate peaked at 46.0 percent in 2020, then dropped to 22.3 percent by 2022.
