n recognition of the unique needs of vulnerable populations, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office has scaled up its National ID System implementation by extending its purok-based registration strategy to house-to-house operations— specifically tailored to reach vulnerable groups such as persons with disabilities (PWDs), senior citizens, and infants, including children under one year old.

Among the beneficiaries of this expanded outreach was Ms. Romana Rodelas Cardenas, an 85-year-old resident of Bangcuangan, Santa Cruz, Marinduque. Due to age-related mobility challenges, she was unable to visit the nearest registration site. Recognizing her right to identity and legal documentation, the PSA Marinduque registration team took the initiative to bring the registration services directly to her home, ensuring she received the services to which she is entitled.

This initiative is a direct and compassionate response to the identified challenges faced by these sectors in accessing fixed registration centers due to mobility, health, or age-related limitations. By deploying trained mobile registration teams equipped with portable registration kits, PSA PSO Marinduque is ensuring that essential identification services reach even the most remote and underserved households across the province.

The house-to-house and purok-based strategy highlights the agency's commitment to equitable service delivery. The program operates through close coordination with barangay officials and families, ensuring that the registration process is safe, efficient, and dignified at the community level.#

PSA Marinduque Successfully Conducts May 2025 Palay and Corn Production and Stocks Surveys

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) – Marinduque Provincial Statistical Office successfully conducted the May 2025 Monthly Palay and Corn Situation Reporting System (MPCSRS) and the Rice and Corn Stocks Surveys: Commercial (RCSS:C) and Household (RCSS:H) from May 1 to 5, 2025.

The MPCSRS monitors the growing conditions and planting activities of palay and corn to update and project quarterly production estimates. For this round, two Statistical Researchers (SRs) interviewed 94 sample palay-farming households and 47 cornfarming households from selected barangays.

Meanwhile, the RCSS:C and RCSS:H collected rice and corn stock data from 7 sample establishments in 6 barangays and 167 households in 12 barangays, respectively. These monthly surveys support food supply monitoring, policy formulation, and emergency response

In a move to bridge service gaps in remote areas, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Marinduque recently conducted a National ID registration drive in Barangay Hinapulan, one of Boac's most hard-to-reach communities.

Held alongside the DSWD's 4Ps Family Development Session, the activity allowed residents—including children under five and senior citizens—to register for the National ID. To accommodate those with mobility issues, the team also conducted house-to-house registration.

A total of 38 individuals were registered, mostly young children and elderly residents. Additionally, 74 National IDs in paper format were issued, providing essential access to government services, healthcare, and financial aid. This initiative reflects PSA's continued efforts to make identification services inclusive and accessible to



May 2025 Inflation Report

The headline inflation rate at the provincial level declined to 1.0 percent in May 2025, or a change of 1.1 percentage points from the inflation rate in the previous month. In the same reference month of the previous year, it was posted at 1.9 percent. The downtrend of inflation in May 2025 was mainly driven by the combined deceleration in the indices for selected commodity groups such as food and non-alcoholic beverages at 0.6 percent, housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels at 2.5 percent, and information and communication at 0.1 percent.

Furthermore, lower annual increment was also observed in the inflation rates for the personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services and alcoholic beverages and tobacco at 1.0 percent and 5.8 percent, respectively.

On the other hand, the annual indices of the following commodity groups showed higher growth compared to the previous month, as follows:

- Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance, 3.1%;
- Health, 1.6%;
- Transport, -1.1%; and,
- Restaurants and accommodation services, 0.0%.

Meanwhile, the indices of the following commodity groups maintained compared with the annual figures from the previous month, as follows:

- Clothing and footwear, 1.1%;
- Recreation, sport and culture, 2.4%;
- · Education services, 1.1%; and,
- Financial services, 0.0%.

The downtrend in food inflation was mainly due to the deceleration in the indices of rice at -14.4 percent, fish and other seafood at 3.4 percent, and meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals at 8.7 percent.

The Purchasing Power of Peso (PPP) in Marinduque increased to PhP 0.76 in May 2025, same with PhP 0.76 in May 2024.#

As of May 2025, 213,379 Marinduqueños have registered for the National ID, covering 89.20% of the provincial target.


In May alone, 1,177 individuals were registered—91.24% of the monthly goal—including 1,068 aged 5 and above and 109 under 5, through visits to 32 barangays.Boac leads with 54,065 registrants (94.38%), followed by Santa Cruz (48,348), Gasan (31,187), Mogpog (29,622), Torrijos (27,829), and Buenavista (22,328).#


165K National IDs in Paper Format Issued in Marinduque

As of the latest count, 165,055 National IDs in paper format have been issued in Marinduque. Santa Cruz recorded the highest distribution with 42,014 IDs, followed by Boac (33,119), Gasan (25,451), Mogpog (23,357), Torrijos (23,667), and Buenavista (17,350).

An additional 97 IDs were issued to residents from other provinces.#










