2009 PCOICOP

The 2009 Philippine Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (PCOICOP) is a detailed classification of individual consumption expenditures on goods and services.



2002 PCPC

The 2002 Philippine Central Product Classification (PCPC) is a standard classification of goods and services, including tangible assets based on their physical properties and intrinsic nature as well as industrial origin.



PSGC

The Philippine Standard Geographic Code (PSGC) is a classification and coding of the geographical-political subdivisions of the country, such as the region, the province, the municipality/city and the barangay.



2018 PSCCS

The 2018 Philippine Standard Classification of Crime for Statistical Purposes (PSCCS) is the first edition of the country's classification of crimes. It is a hierarchical classification where criminal offenses are allocated into categories that have a certain degree of similarity.

2019 PSIC

The 2019 Updates to the Philippine Standard Industrial Classification (PSIC) is a detailed classification of industries prevailing in the country according to the kind of productive activities undertaken by establishments.

2022 PSCC

The 2022 Philippine Standard Commodity Classification (PSCC) is a detailed classification of all commodities that enter the Philippine trade.

2012 PSOC

The 2012 Philippine Standard Occupational Classification (PSOC) is a classification of the different occupations of the working population, including the military workforce of the country.

2017 PSCED

The 2017 Philippine Standard Classification of Education (PSCED) is a detailed classification of all educational levels in the Philippine Educational System.

2016 PTSCS

The 2016 Philippine Tourism Statistical Classification System (PTSCS) is a detailed classification of tourism characteristic products and industries.
