

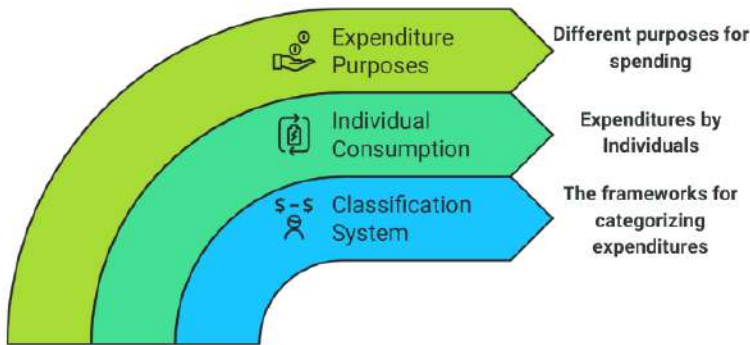
DID YOU KNOW?

The 2009 Philippine Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (PCOICOP) is the first standard classification of individual consumption expenditures in the country.



The 2009 PCOICOP is based on the 1999 COICOP developed by the UN Statistics Division. It serves as a vital classification system within the 1993 and 2008 System of National Accounts (SNA), enabling consistent analysis of consumption data in the Philippines.

Criteria for the Classification of Goods and Services

Purpose of Consumption

Includes nourishing the body (food), preventing or curing illness (health), acquiring knowledge (education), traveling (transport), and protecting against weather (clothing).

Relevance

The significance of household consumption expenditure in the economy requires identifying key expenditures to highlight or categorize separately in the PCOICOP.

Availability of Goods and Services Consumed

The 2009 PCOICOP was prepared by considering the most commonly purchased items and services by households, based on the FIES and Commodity Outlet Survey, to reflect the local situation.

Five (5) Levels of Detail



PCOICOP Divisions

Division is the broadest category, representing major sectors of the economy.

- Division 01: **Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages**
- Division 02: **Alcoholic Beverages**
- Division 03: **Clothing and Footwear**
- Division 04: **Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels**
- Division 05: **Furnishings, Households Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance**
- Division 06: **Health**
- Division 07: **Transport**
- Division 08: **Communication**
- Division 09: **Recreation and Culture**
- Division 10: **Education**
- Division 11: **Restaurants and Hotels**
- Division 12: **Miscellaneous Goods and Services**
- Division 13: **Individual Consumption Expenditure of Non-Profit Institutions Serving Households**
- Division 13: **Individual Consumption Expenditure of General Government**

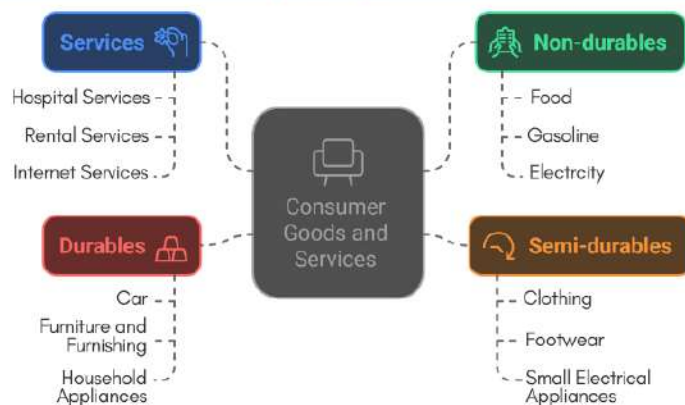
PCOICOP Institutional Sector by Relevant Groups

The framework categorizes consumption across institutional sectors, providing insights into how households and organizations allocate resources for goods and services.



PCOICOP Classes Divided by Type

The framework categorizes consumption into four classes based on the nature and longevity of goods and services



- The first four digits align with UN COICOP for global expenditure commonality.
- The last two digits (fifth and sixth) cater to expenditures specific to the Philippines.
- Sub-class** and **Item** levels maintain class coverage completeness per UN COICOP standards.
