229 or 60.4% of the total recorded deaths occurred at home while 146 or 38.5% of the total recorded deaths occurred at health facilities and remaining four or 1.1% deaths occurred in other places like street, in public spaces, or during transit.

January has the most number of deaths registered at 4**5**.





a total of **379** deaths were timely registered



No death was registered late

There were 29 deaths attended by private physicians, 18 deaths attended by public health officers , one death attended by other health officials and 122 deaths attended by hospital authorities, based on the number of registered deaths by usual residence.

Top 5 Causes of Deaths

2. Motor- or nonmotor-vehicle accident, type of vehicle

1. Acute myocardial infarction -10.6%

3. Respiratory tuberculosis, not confirmed

5. Unspecified diabetes mellitus - 4.0%

bacteriologically or histologically - 5.0% 4. Other cerebrovascular diseases -4.2%

unspecified - 5.5%
