The province is located at the geographical coordinates of 13°6'8.68" N and 120°45'54.46" E.

BOUNDARY

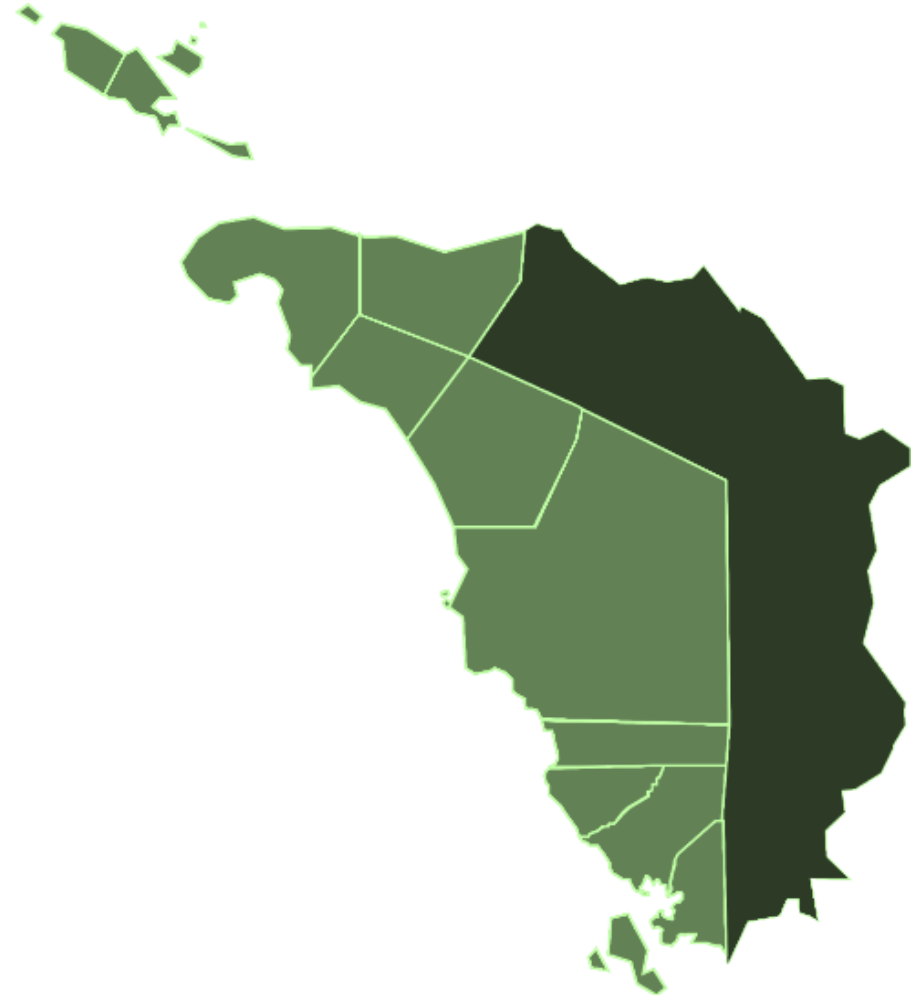
The province of Occidental Mindoro is bordered, clockwise from the North, by the Verde Island Passage, Oriental Mindoro, Sulu Sea, Mindoro Strait, and the South China Sea.

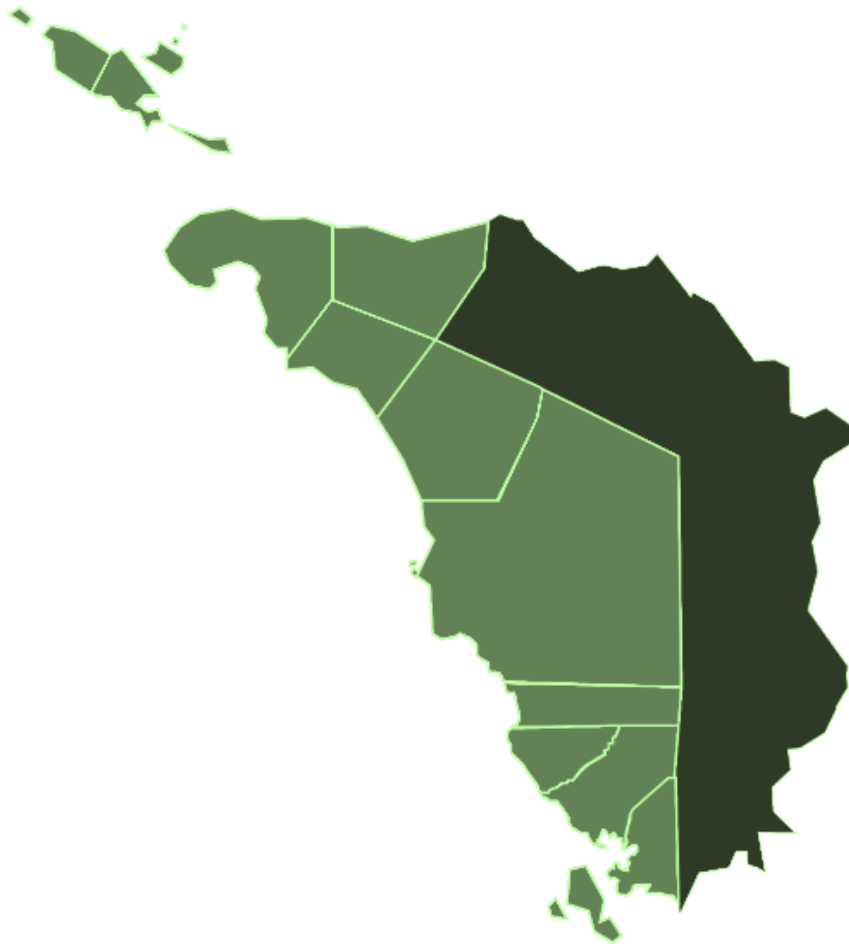
LAND AREA

The province has a total land area of 5, 851.09 square kilometers. It is subdivided into eleven (11) municipalities: Abra de Ilog, Calintaan, Looc, Lubang, Magsaysay, Mamburao (capital), Paluan, Rizal, Sablayan, San Jose, and Santa Cruz. The municipality of Sablayan comprise the largest total land area of 2, 188.80 among the 11 municipalities.

TOPOGRAPHY

The province of Occidental Mindoro is generally rugged, with narrow strips of coastal lowlands. Its terrain is characterized by successive mountain ranges, valleys, and elongated plateaus, with rolling lands along the coastal region.





CLIMATE

Occidental Mindoro has two pronounced seasons: the dry season from November to April, and the wet season during the rest of the year. The average annual volume of rainfall is 2,000 mm. Temperature ranges from 30.7 to 16.4 degrees Celsius.

SOIL TYPE

The province of Occidental Mindoro has many types of soil varying from clay loam to beach sand. According to the Bureau of Soils, these are the soil type present in the province: San Miguel clay loam, San Fabian clay loam, San Miguel loamy soil, San Miguel sandy loam, Banto Malalag complex, Beach sand, Hydrosol, River wash, and Rough mountainous.

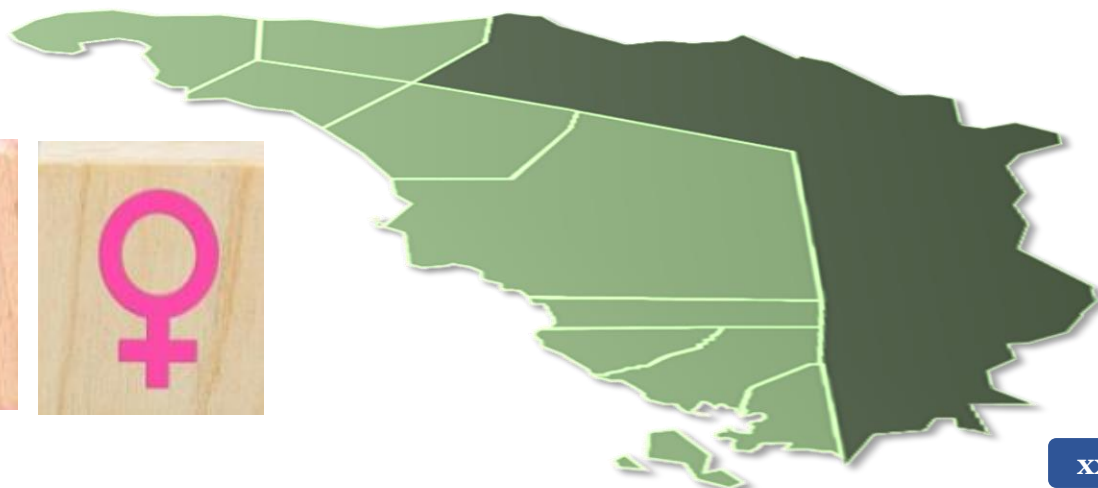

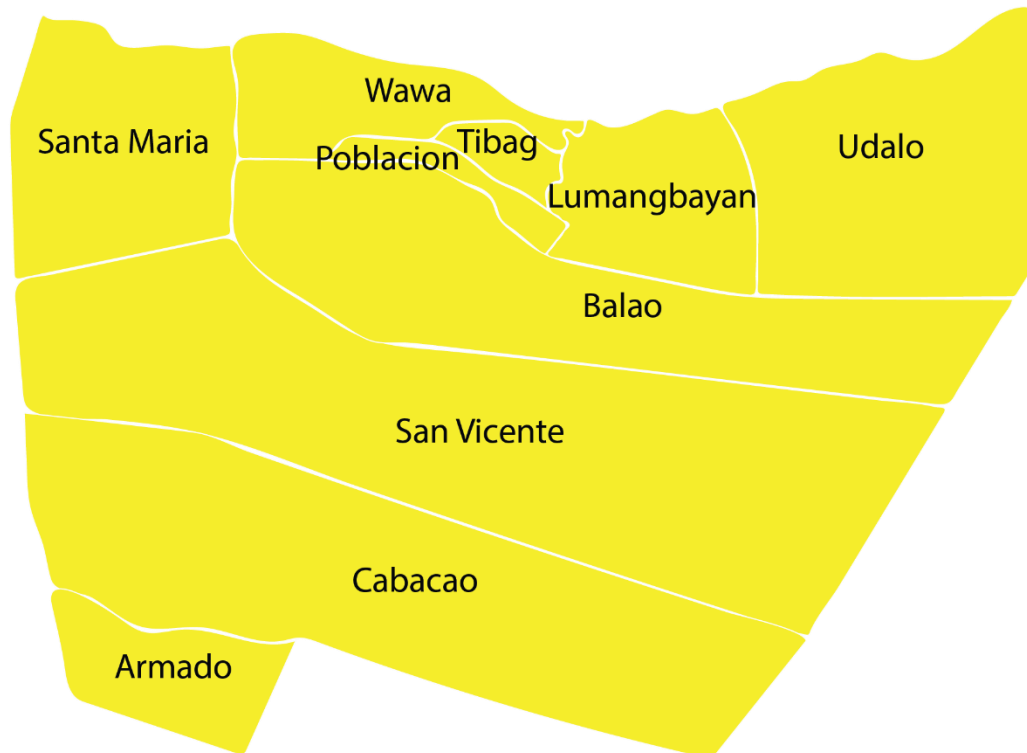

MAP OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ABRA DE ILOG

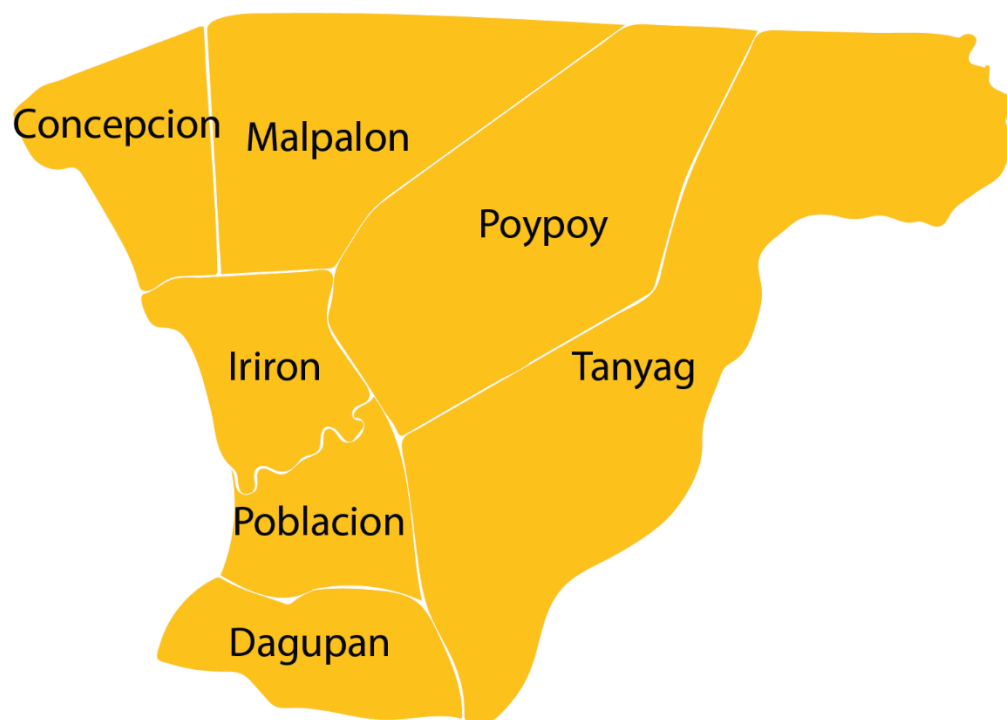

MAP OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF CALINTAAN

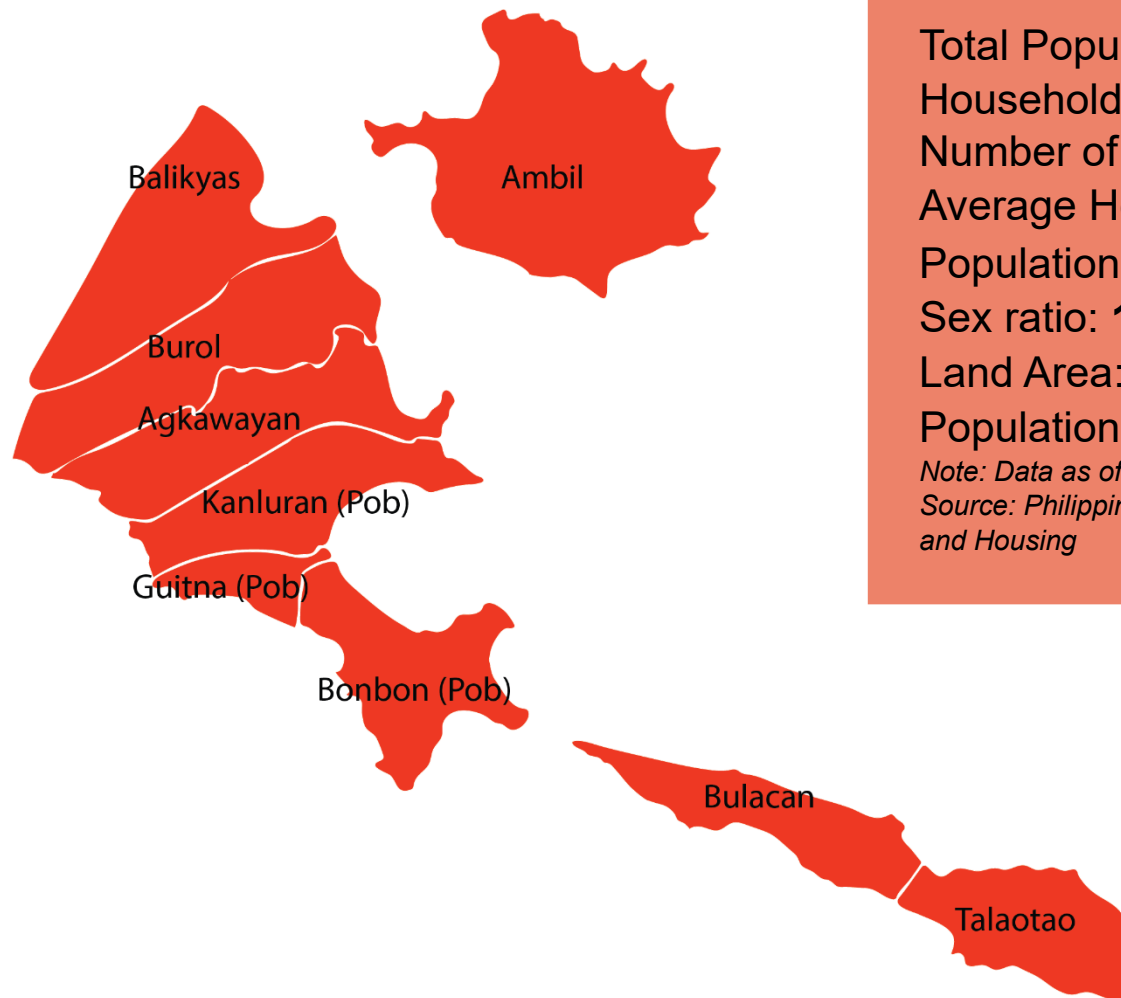

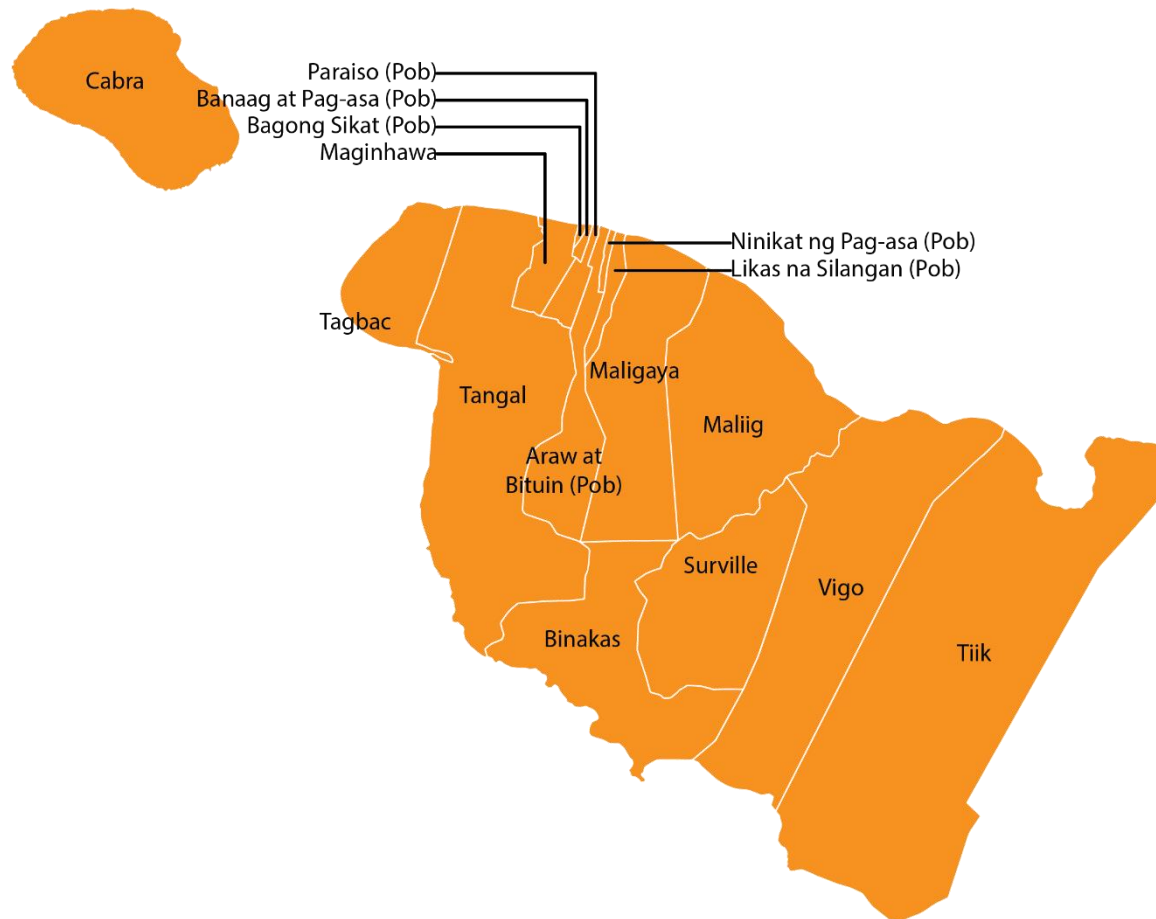

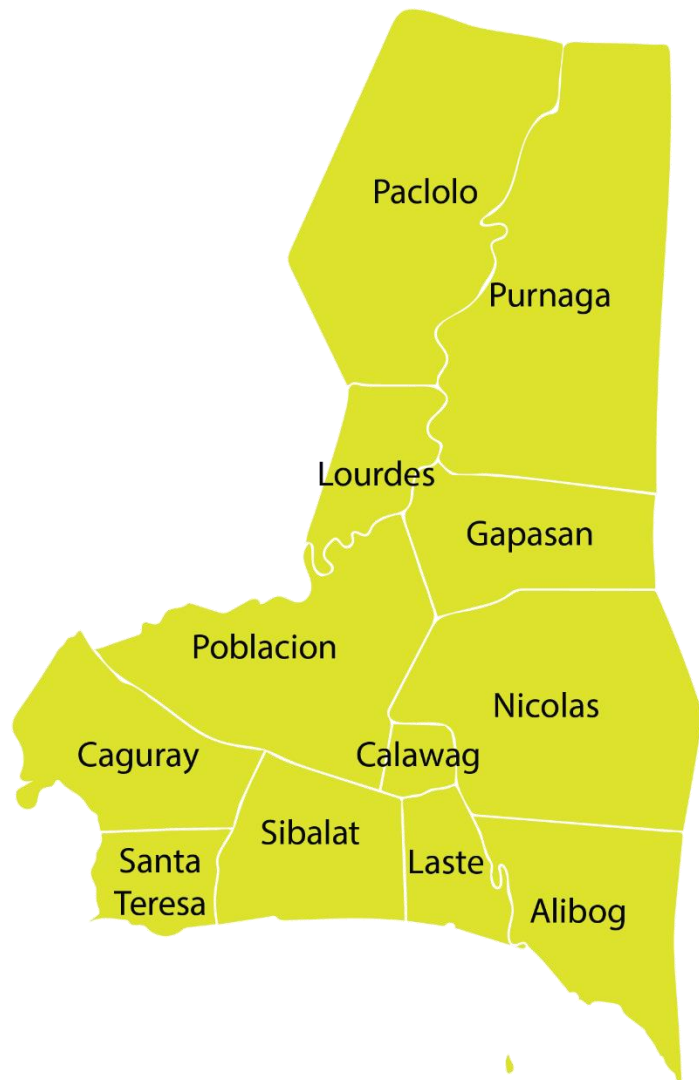

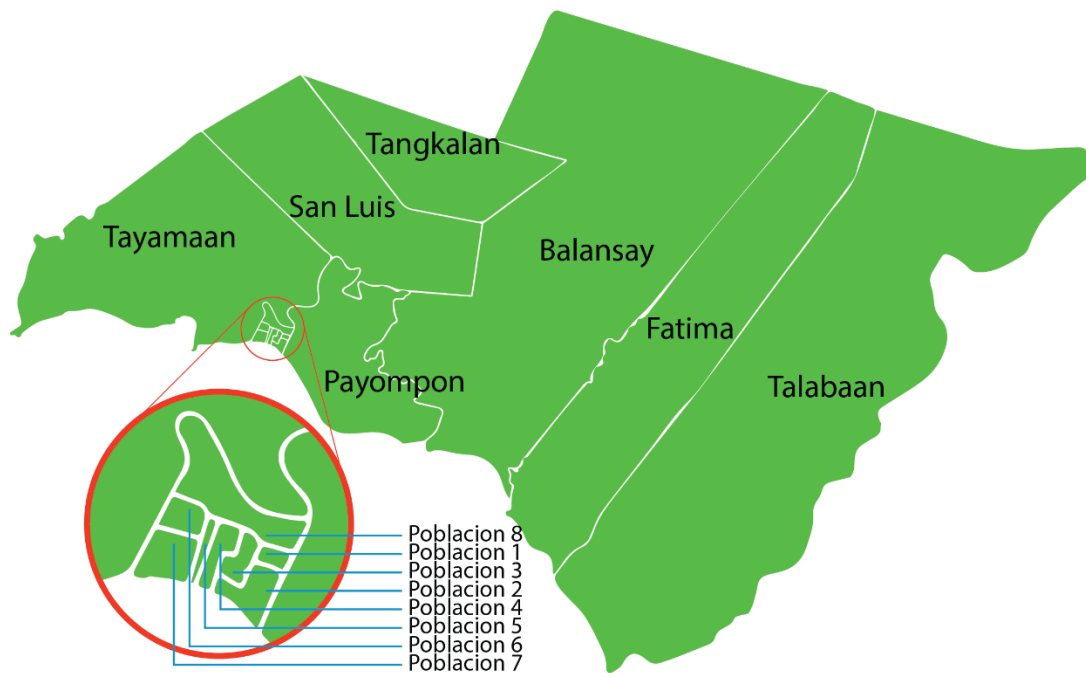

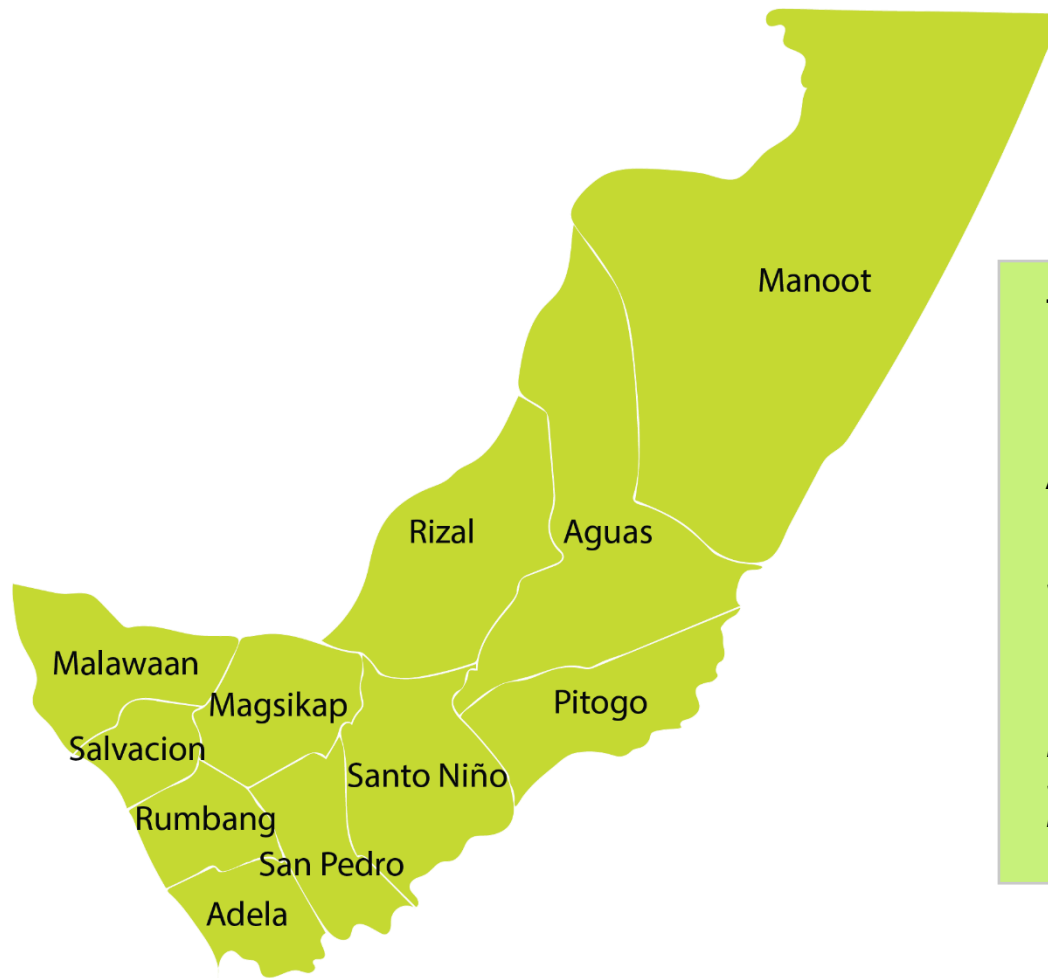

MAP OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF RIZAL

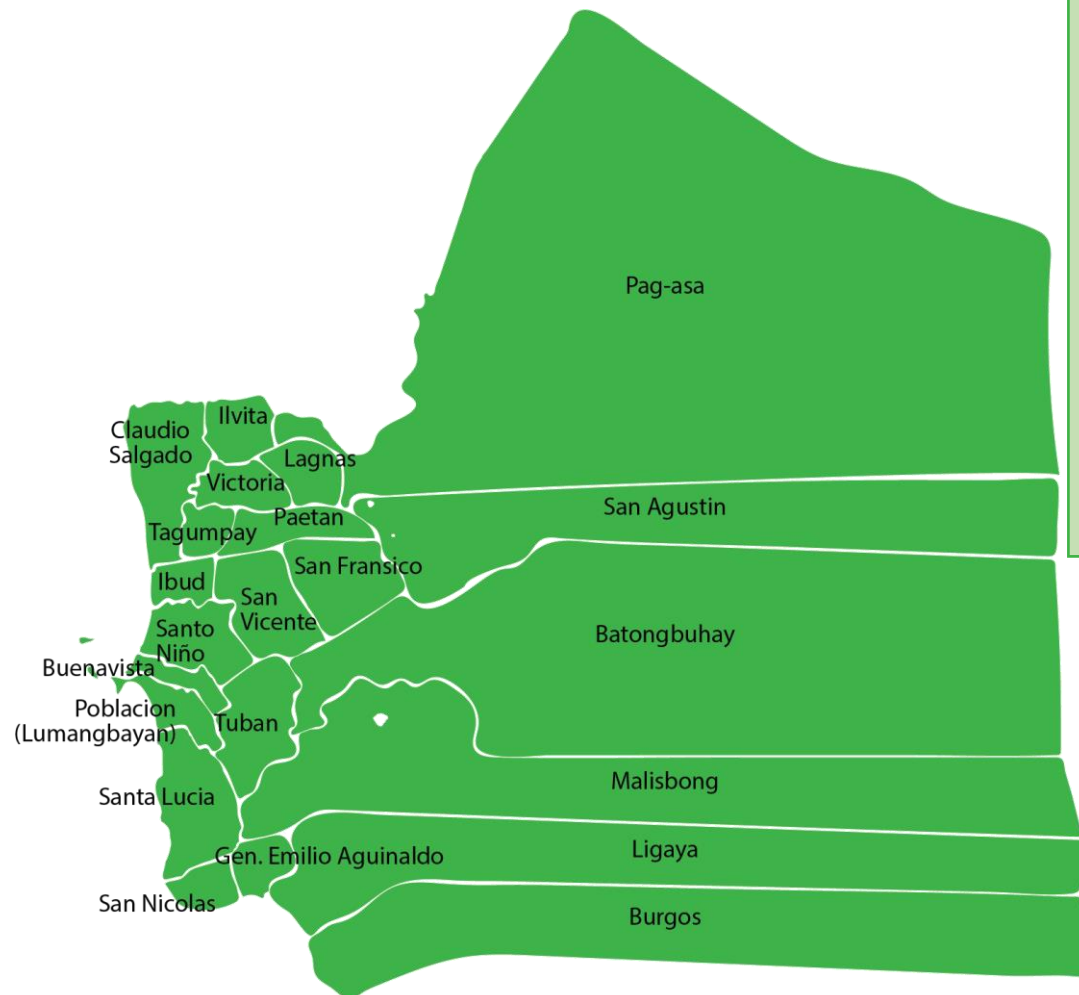

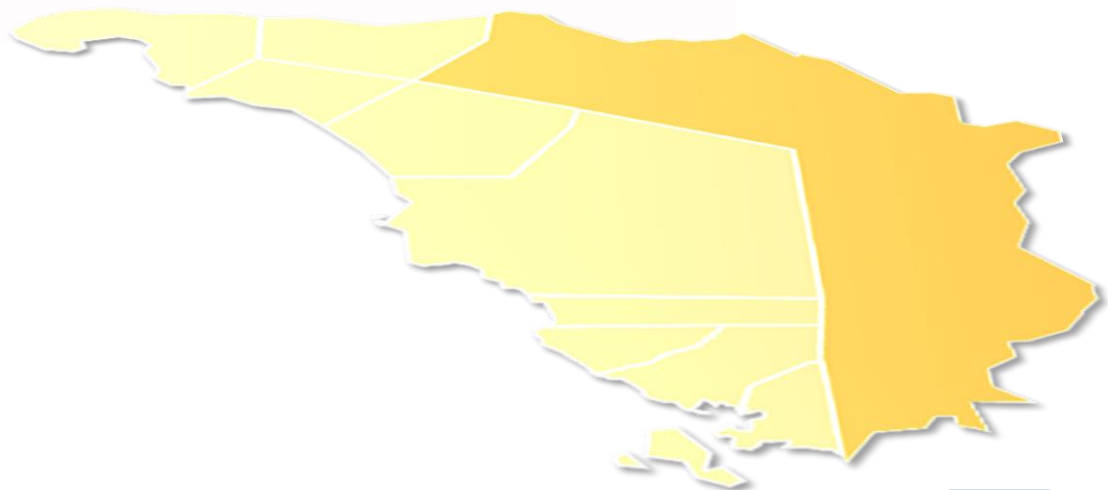

CHAPTER 1 GENERAL INFORMATION

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HIGHLIGHTS

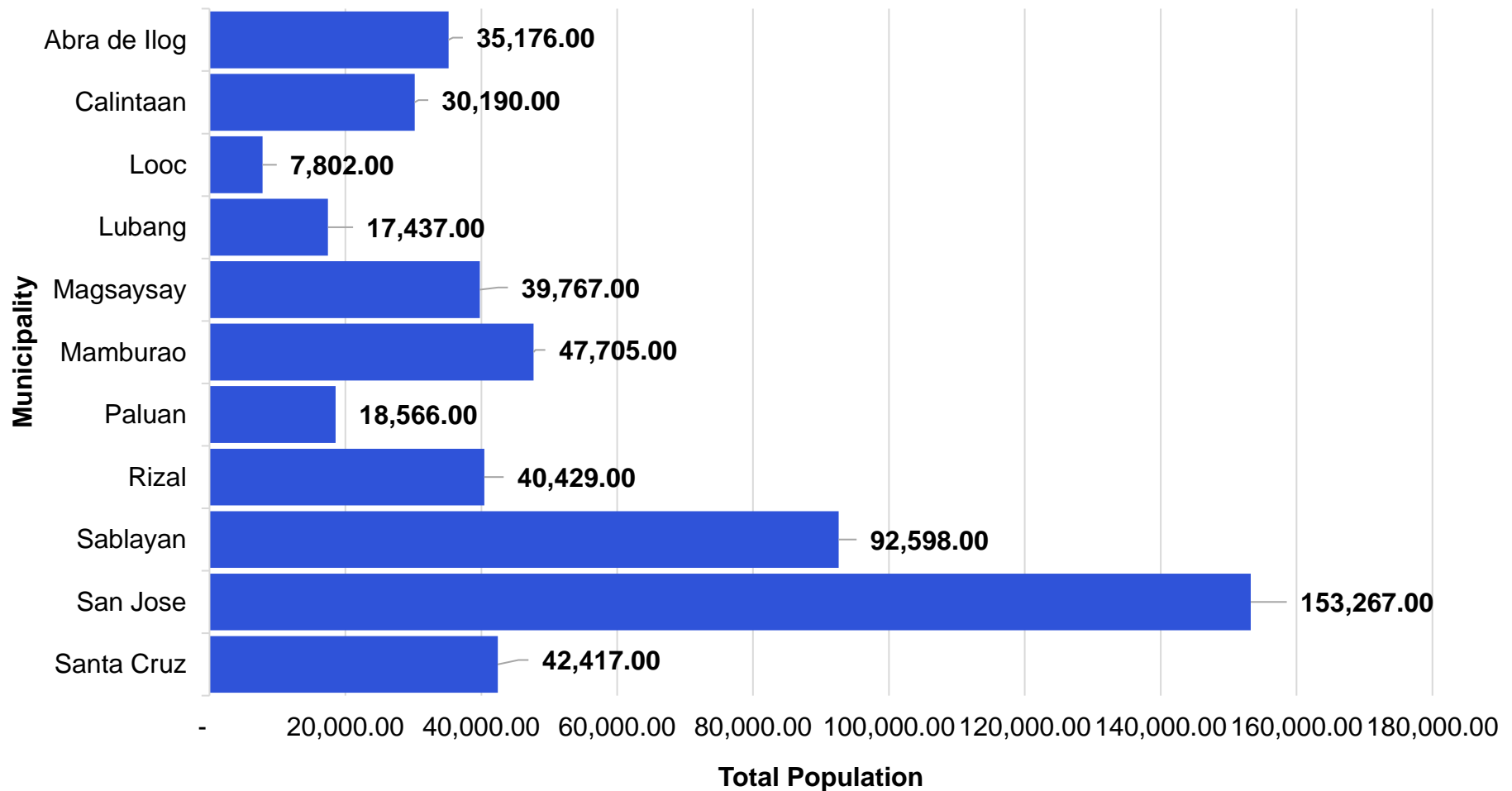
The province of Occidental Mindoro is composed of 11 municipalities. Sablayan with a land area of 2,188.80 km^2 is the largest municipality in terms of land distribution, followed by the municipality of Santa Cruz with a land area of 681.40 km^2 . San Jose is the municipality with the highest number of barangays comprising 39.

Based on the results of the 2020 Census of Population, the total population of the province of Occidental Mindoro was 525, 354. This is higher by 37, 940 than the population of 487, 414 in 2015. The population increased by 1.59 percent annually from 2015 to 2020. Among the eleven (11) municipalities comprising the province of Occidental Mindoro, the municipality of San Jose is the largest in terms of population size with 153, 267 persons.

Among the 11 municipalities, San Jose recorded the highest household population with a household population size making up 29.2 percent of the total household population of the province. The municipality of Sablayan came in second with 17.6 percent share followed by the municipality of Mamburao with 9.1 percent share, municipality of Santa Cruz with 8.1 percent. The municipality of Looc displayed the least household population with a 1.5 percent share of the total household population of the province.

Ages from 5 years old to 9 years old during 2020 recorded the highest household population group with 61,101 and ages 80 years and over as the least household population age group.

CHAPTER 2 VITAL STATISTICS

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HIGHLIGHTS

Marriages

- In 2022, the number of marriages conducted in the province of Occidental Mindoro was recorded at 2,312. Most of the marriages recorded in 2022 were conducted during the months of February, April, and December.
- Marriages most frequently occurred in the municipality of San Jose, which has the highest population.
- 2022 Vital Statistics on Marriages shows that grooms and brides aged 25 to 29 years were the most common age group to get married.
- The municipality of Sablayan recorded the highest number of late-registered marriages, with 30, while the municipality of San Jose recorded the highest number of timely registered marriages, with 601.

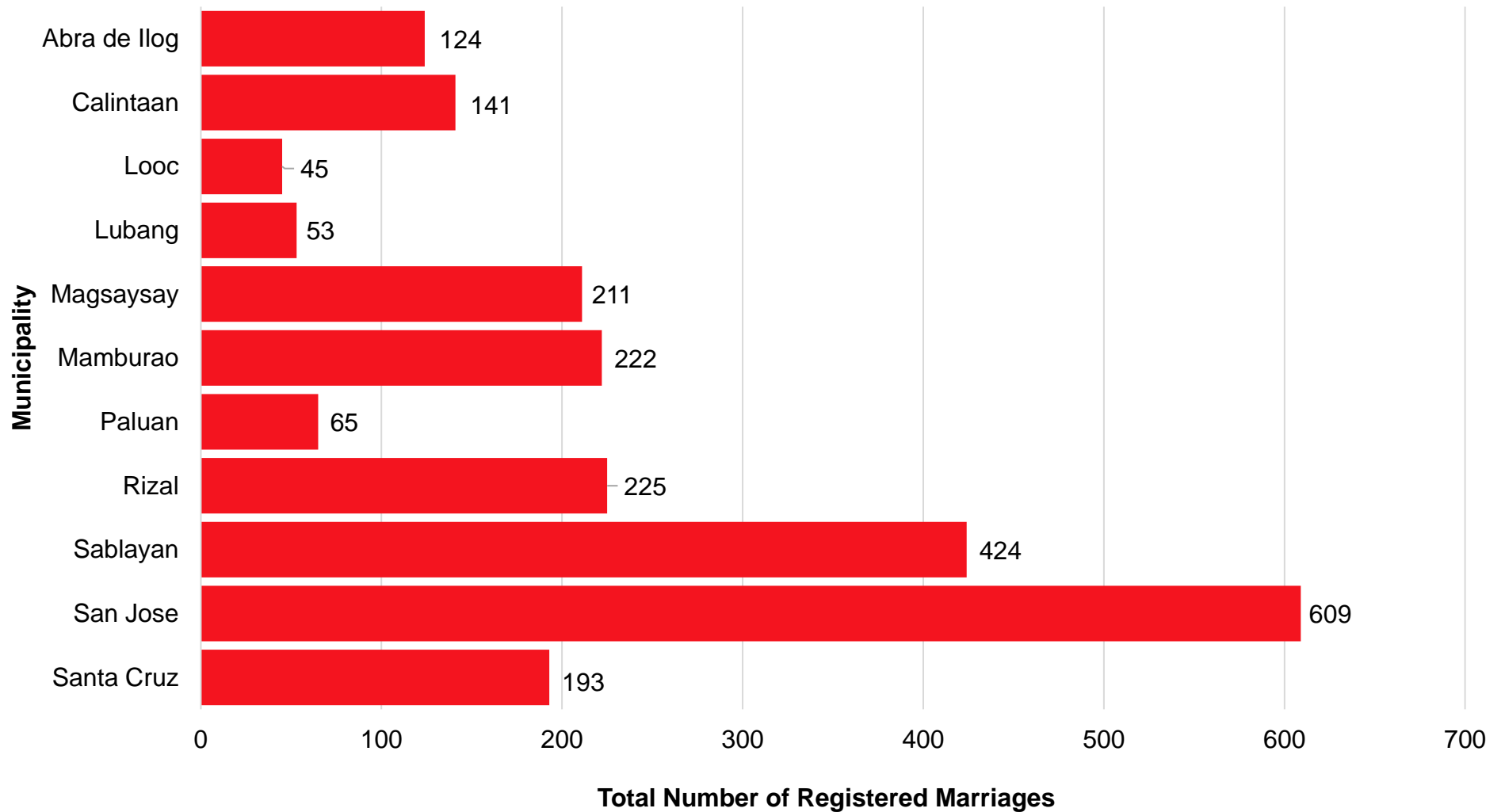
Births

- In 2022, the total number of live births in the province of Occidental Mindoro recorded at 7,651.
- 2022 Vital Statistics on Births shows that the municipality of San Jose recorded the highest number of live births with 2,386, while the municipality of Looc recorded only with 23 live births. Birth occurrences were high during the month of September, October, and January.
- Health facilities recorded a higher number of live births compared to home births.

Deaths

- During 2022, the total number of 2,954 death occurrences was recorded.
- San Jose recorded the highest number of registered deaths which was 1,011 while the municipality of Looc recorded only 39 registered deaths.
- Most males died at ages 60 to 64 and 70 to 74 in 2022, while most females died at age 85 and over. Diseases of the circulatory system were the most frequent underlying cause of death.

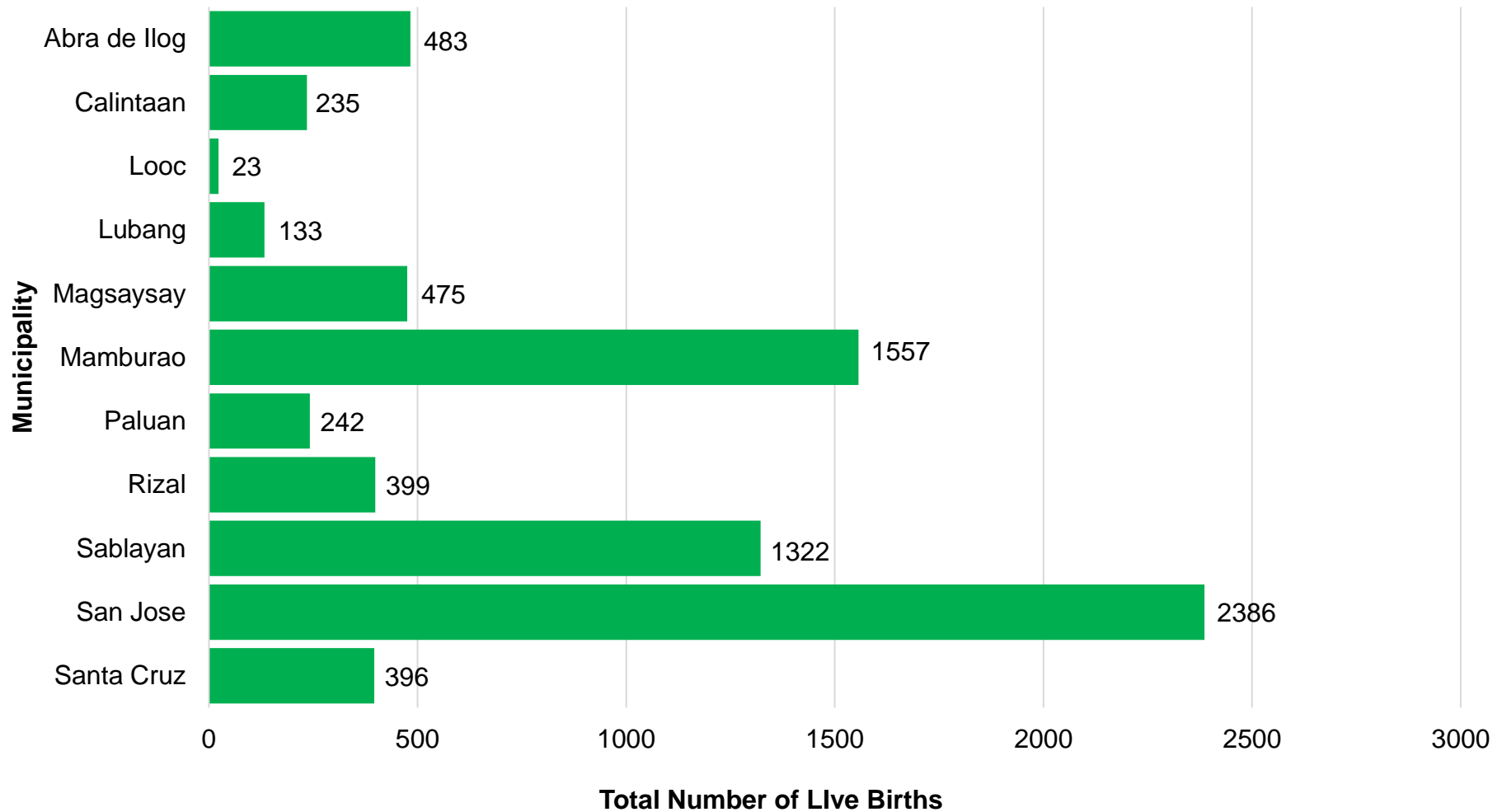

Figure 2.2. Total Number of Live Births by Municipality, Occidental Mindoro: 2022



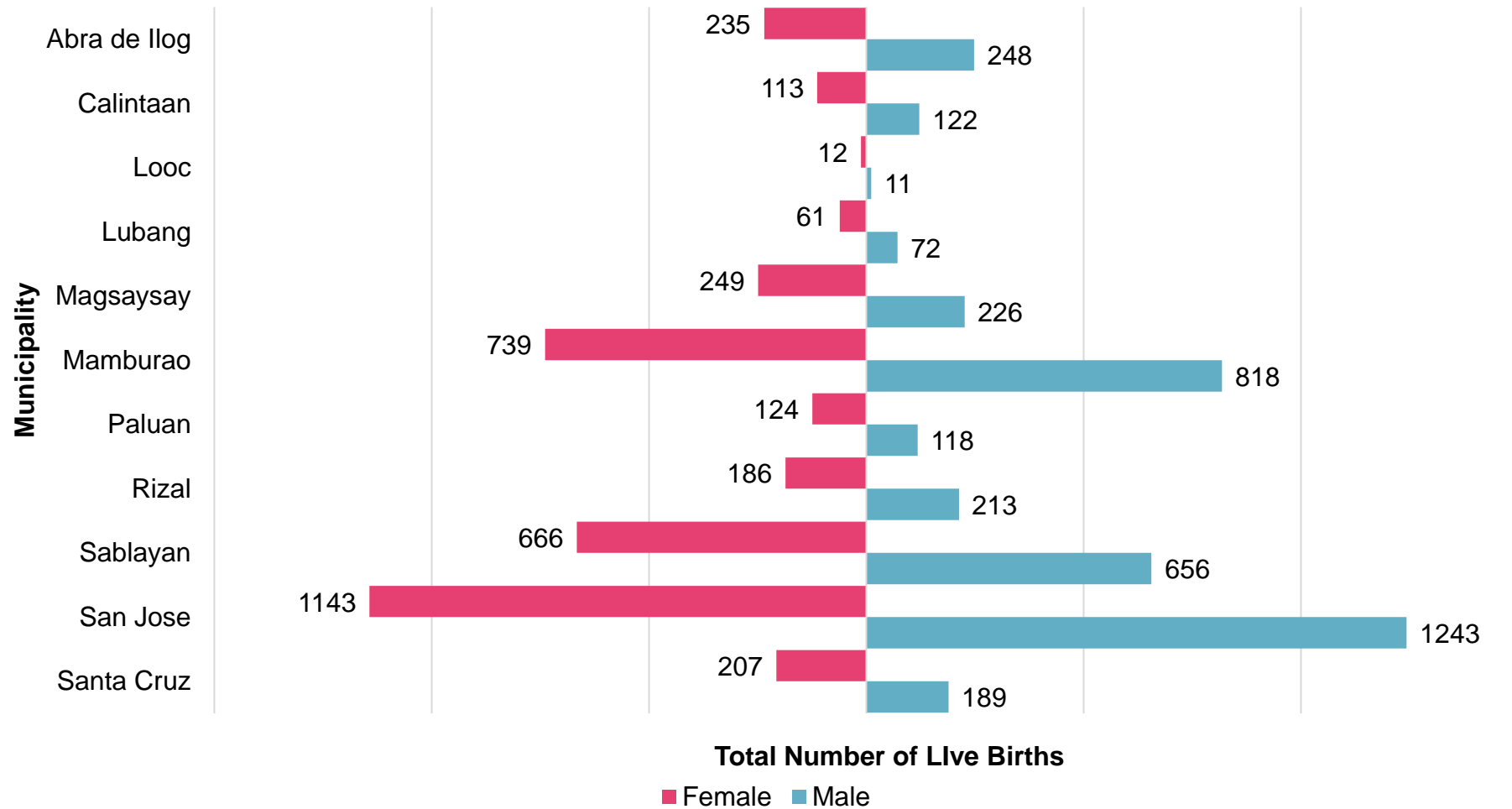

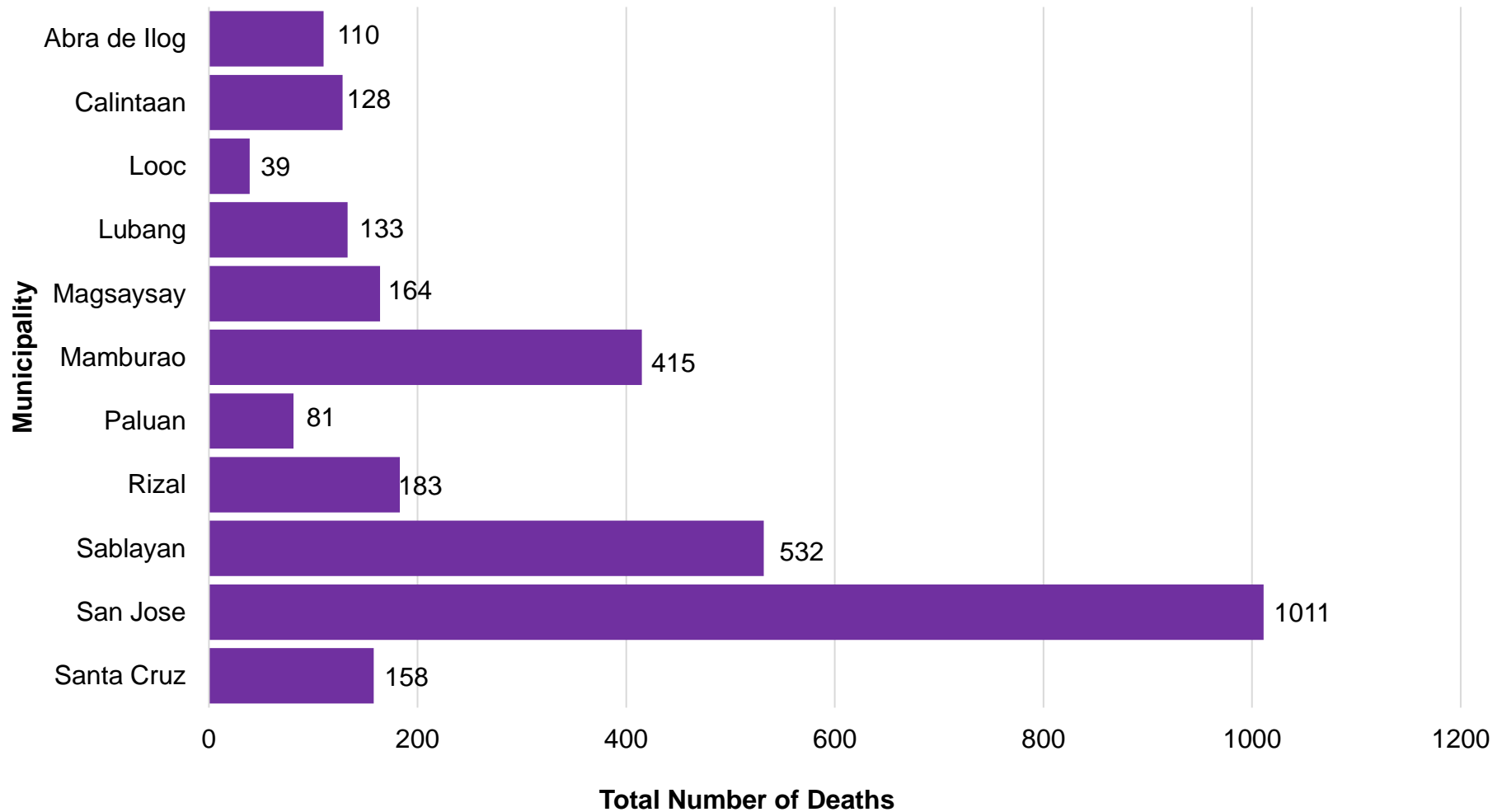

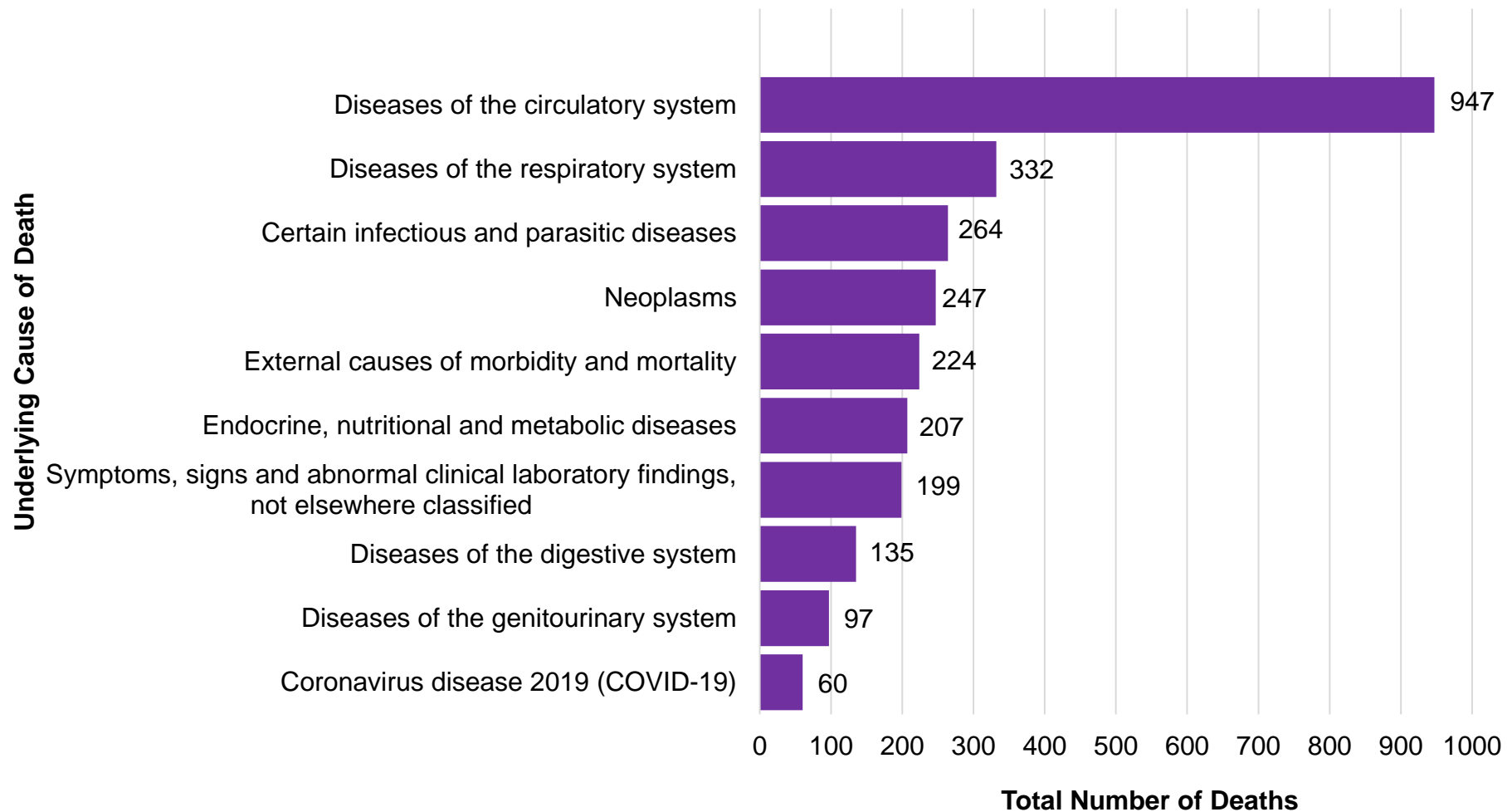

CHAPTER 3 AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, AND FISHERIES

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HIGHLIGHTS

Cereals

- A total of 427,136.42 metric tons production of palay was recorded in 2023 which decreased by 7.72 percent compared to the production in 2022 and an area harvested of 95,662.32 hectares which also decreased. The decrement in total palay production was attributed to a decline in both irrigated and rainfed palay production and the area harvested.
- The production of corn recorded in 2023 was 99,389.93 metric tons which slightly decreased by 1.19 percent compared to the production in 2022. The decrease was attributed to a decline in white corn production, despite an increase in yellow corn production.

Crops

- The highest-producing non-food and industrial crops commodity in the province of Occidental Mindoro was coconut during the years 2021 to 2023. The coconut recorded 17,070.80 metric tons production in 2023 which decreased by 6.43 percent compared to the production in 2022 despite an increase in area harvested.
- The top three producing fruit commodities in the province of Occidental Mindoro during the years 2021 to 2023 were Banana, Papaya, and Mango. In 2023, Banana production recorded 3,970.04 metric tons of production which decreased by 3.32 percent compared to the previous year, followed by Papaya with 3,791.76 which also decreased by 12.76 percent. On the other hand, Mango production of 1,702.53 metric tons increased by 0.98 percent compared to the previous year.
- In vegetable crops, the 2023 top three producing commodities in the province were Onion, Sweet potato, and Cassava. Relative to the preceding year, Onion recorded 46,793.08 metric tons production which exhibited an annual decline of 16.38 percent. Sweet potato with 9,138.42 metric tons production, and Cassava with 5,452.49 metric tons production also exhibited an annual decrement of 8.39 percent and 9.30 percent respectively compared to the preceding year.

Livestock and Poultry

- Hog, as the top livestock producing in the province, recorded 8,092.64 metric tons of production in 2023 which increased by 0.83 percent compared to the previous year. On the other hand, Goat as the least producing in the province recorded 310.04 metric tons of production which exhibited an annual increment of 6.43 percent compared to the previous year.

- In terms of poultry, Chicken recorded a total of 1,442.53 metric tons of production in 2023 which declined by 2.03 percent compared to the previous year. On the other hand, the chicken egg production of 1,367.42 increased by 13.44 percent.

Fisheries

- The substantial annual increment of fisheries production in 2023 relative to the previous year was remarkably noticeable. Among the fisheries sub-sectors, Municipal Fisheries contributed the most with 12,908.43 metric tons production in 2023 with a value of Php1.49 billion.

HEALTH AND NUTRITION



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HIGHLIGHTS

- The total number of hospitals in Occidental Mindoro remained constant at 200 from 2021 to 2022. However, in 2023, the number decreased to 175 total hospitals which is lower than the preceding years.
- The province had 2,920 identified skilled health personnel in the fourth quarter of 2023 including medical doctors, dentists, public health nurses, midwives, nutritionists, medical technologists, sanitary inspectors, and barangay health workers.
- A total of 7,160 children were fully immunized in 2023. The under-5 mortality rate was 19.13 percent in 2023. Additionally, the infant mortality rate was 5.27 percent in the fourth quarter of 2023.
- In 2023, a contraceptive prevalence rate during the fourth quarter of 2023 was recorded at 37.61 percent which is higher than the prevalence rate of 33.18 percent of the same period of the previous year.
- Out of 130,027 households in 2023, a total of 108,221 households, or 83.23 percent had basic sanitation facilities which is higher than the preceding year of 76.34 percent of the total households.
- A notable increase in Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) infections was observed from 2021 to 2023.

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HIGHLIGHTS

- During the Academic Year 2022 to 2023, the province recorded 408 schools of which 364 are public and 44 are private.
- A total of 3,257 teachers was recorded during the fiscal year 2020.
- The 2022-2023 school year recorded a 101.67% gross enrollment rate in elementary school, higher than the previous year. The senior high school gross enrollment rate was 92.30%, higher than the previous year. On the other hand, the junior high school gross enrollment rate was 92.39%, lower than the previous year, primarily due to a decline in private school enrollment. Further, enrollment in state universities and colleges also decreased.
- Retention rate in elementary schools is higher than the previous years during the academic year 2022 to 2023 but noticeably lower in junior and senior high school.
- Survival rate and completion rate in elementary school, junior high school, and senior high school for both public and private declined during the academic year 2022 to 2023 relative to the preceding year.

CHAPTER 7
PEACE AND ORDER

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HIGHLIGHTS

- The police-to-population ratio fluctuates across municipalities of Occidental Mindoro in different quarters from the year 2021 to 2023. Some municipalities, like San Jose, consistently maintain a relatively high ratio throughout the period. Others, such as Paluan, have a lower ratio that varies slightly.
- A total of 866 crimes were reported in 2023, lower than the 997 cases reported in 2022. Index crimes in 2023 posted 190 cases which increased by 28.38 percent compared to the previous year while non-index crimes had a total of 470 cases which decreased by 26.10 percent compared to the preceding year.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

GENERAL INFORMATION

Household – a social unit consisting of a person living alone or a group of persons who sleep in the same housing unit and have a common arrangement in the preparation and consumption of food.

Household Population – the population enumerated in private households during a census.

Household Size – number of usual members in a private household.

Population – total number of individuals in a territory at a specified time. It covers both nationals and aliens, native and foreign-born persons, internees, refugees and any other group physically present within the borders of a country at a specified time. In assembling national demographic statistics for publication, the basic aim has been to obtain data for the physically present (or de facto) population rather than for the legally established resident (or de jure) inhabitants.

Population Census – the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing, and publishing demographic, economic, and social data pertaining to all persons in the country or in a well-limited territory.

Population Density – refers to the number of persons per unit of land area (usually in square kilometers). This measure is more meaningful if given as population per unit of arable land.

Population Growth Rate – indicates how fast a population increases or decreases because of the interplay of births, deaths, and migration during a given period. Where the population is closed, meaning no migration, the population growth rate is the same as the rate of natural increase, i.e., the difference between the number of births and the number of deaths during a specified period. The three methods for computing the rate of growth based on the assumption with respect to the change are arithmetic change, geometric change, and exponential change.

VITAL STATISTICS

Live birth – is the complete expulsion or extraction of a product of conception from its mother irrespective of the duration of the pregnancy, which after such separation, breathes or shows any evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached-each product of such a birth is considered live born.

Marriage – a special contract of permanent union between a man and a woman entered in accordance with law for the establishment of conjugal and family life.

Death – refers to the permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after live birth has taken place (postnatal cessation of vital functions without capability of resuscitation).

AGRICULTURE, FISHERIES AND FORESTRY

Livestock – distinguished from other animals by the fact that they're domesticated and raised for food or money

Poultry – are domesticated avian species that can be raised for eggs, meat and/or feathers

HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Health Personnel –all paid and unpaid persons serving in healthcare settings who have the potential for direct or indirect exposure to patients or infectious materials

Immunized –a person or animal, immune to infection, typically by inoculation.

Fully Immunized Child– Infants who received one dose of BCG, three doses each of OPV, DPT, and Hepatitis B vaccines, and one dose of measles vaccine before reaching one year of age.

Sanitary or improved toilet – refers to an approved type of toilet facility used for receiving, safely containing (i.e., ensures hygienic separation of human excreta from human contact) and disposing human waste. The type of sanitary toilet includes the following as per NEDA Board Resolution No. 12, series of 1995: 1) Sanitary Pit Privy; 2) Ventilated Improved Pit; 3) Pour Flush Toilet to a receiving sewer, septic tank or leaching pit; and 4) Flush Toilet to a receiving sewer or septic tank.

EDUCATION

Repetition rate – this is an EFA indicator that determines the magnitude of pupils/students who repeat a grade/year level.

Enrollment – the total number of students who have registered in a given school year.

TRANSPORT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Road Network – the system of interconnected roads designed to accommodate wheeled road going vehicles and pedestrian traffic

Land Transport – the transport or movement of people, animals or goods from one location to another location on land

PEACE AND ORDER

Crimes – include felonies which are violations of the Revised Penal Code and offenses which are violations of special laws. For statistical purposes, only crimes reported to authorities are covered.

Crime Volume – is the number of crime incidents committed in each area over a period which include the index and non-index crimes.

Index Crimes – are crimes which are serious in nature, and which occur with sufficient frequency and regularity such that they can serve as an index to the crime situation. Considered as index crimes are murder, homicide, physical injury (serious and less serious), carnapping, cattle rustling, robbery, theft, and rape.
